### **Behavior Strategies & Autism** by Dr. Lorrie Bryant

**Discussion will center on the basic principles of behavior and effective strategies for increasing adaptive behavior and decreasing behavioral excesses that cause difficulty for children with autism spectrum disorders. Parents will have the opportunity to ask questions afterwards.**

Lorrie E. Bryant is a licensed psychologist in private practice in Lincoln, Nebraska. Dr. Bryant's experience in working with children and adults with Autism Spectrum Disorders and other Developmental Disabilities and learning disorders began in the mid 1970's. Her experience spans over 30 years and ranges from being a teaching assistant in the first public school classroom for children with severe-profound disabilities in Hastings, Nebraska to directing several day treatment, educational, and vocational training programs for children and adults with severe disabilities and behavioral impairments in Chicago, Illinois. Dr. Bryant received her doctoral degree in 1996 from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in the area of school psychology. After working as a school psychologist for Lincoln Public Schools for three years, she entered private practice at the Behavioral Pediatric and Family Therapy Program in 1998. Her private practice focus includes evaluation, behavioral and cognitive-behavioral therapy, parent training, and consultation for children ranging in age from 2 years through high school. While Dr. Bryant primarily works with individuals on the Autism Spectrum and their families, she also completes psychological evaluations and provides therapy and consultation for other childhood concerns including AD/HD, mood disorders, anxiety, and learning disabilities.
